AND SO THE NEW YEAR BEGINS. . .

After the build-up to Christmas and after the wonderful Christmas Eve services, we get a few days to rest, to eat too much, to enjoy time with family and friends. Then comes New Year's Eve, with the requisite dropping of the glittering ball in Times Square in New York City. Parties and fireworks usher in the new year, and for a week or so, newspapers and

magazines focus on New Year's Resolutions, fitness, and diet regimens (which most of us need after the Christmas gluttony).

Late December and early January are times when we get out those new calendars or

Day Planners (despite having a Blackberry, I still prefer to use pen and paper to do yearly and monthly planning) and begin to fill in the spaces. It is also a time when many folks make New Year's Resolutions.

I gave that business up years ago, because it became too frustrating. Regardless of how good the resolution, or how determined I began the process of keeping one, it was never long before I felt like a failure. I decided that life is too short to sabotage myself, then to feel guilty. Instead, I began to make some general goals for the year ahead, then make some monthly goals, and then write out weekly goals. By doing weekly goals that support longer-range goals, I feel like I have accomplished something when I check them off or cross them out. Perhaps it is just semantics—goals vs. resolutions—but for me, it works much

better, and I get much less frustrated. It is as if I break big goals into more manageable chunks and thereby accomplish more in the long-term.

As I look back over 2010 at St. Philip's, I think about the Vestry Retreat last February. In 2008 and 2009, the Vestry had set three yearly goals. However, last year—although we agreed that we would *continue* to work on previously set goals of welcoming and incorporating newcomers into our parish family, and paying attention to Christian Education—we decided to focus primarily on financial issues—specifically, on raising enough money for the Nave & Roof Project. We also knew that by the end of 2010, we had to refinance the mortgage on Wyatt Ministry Center, so that project was worked on by several key folks through the year.

Sharpening our focus on our goal of raising \$125,000 for our Nave & Roof Project worked very well. We had reached that goal by the end of August! And by December 31, parishioners and friends had given \$133,658 for this project. Of course, we ran into some unexpected surprises last summer during the Truss Reinforcement part of the project—but we had guessed that might happen. After all the Truss expenses were paid, we have almost \$70,000 remaining in the Nave and Roof Project fund (this includes an earlier bequest given specifically for a new roof).

Although as of this writing, we still do not know the cost of the new roof (it could run close to \$100K), nor do we know what unexpected surprises we might

run into. We are hoping that with the **Winterfest** Fundraiser on Saturday, March 5, and some other small fundraisers, we will have a new roof on our worship space by the end of this summer—paid for!

It has been said that if you do not know where you are going, any old map will do. But if you know where you are going, you want specific directions, signposts, and a sense that you've made progress en route. With the Vestry's focus on the Nave & Roof Project in 2010, and with your good responses to this, we have not only met this goal, we have exceeded it. Furthermore, regular stewardship moved in a positive direction when compared to the past several years.

We will have our Annual Parish Meeting on February 6th. Then the Vestry will go on their annual retreat Feb. 18-20. At that retreat, we will work with a Retreat Leader to come up with some major goals for 2011. There is a possibility that we may embark on some kind of Capital Campaign to pay off the Wyatt Hall mortgage that we recently re-financed (the total amount re-financed was just over \$516,000.)

Paying off that \$516K debt would make such a difference to this parish. With that debt paid, we could finally set as another goal finishing off the basement space in Wyatt—this could be Sunday School Classroom space for children **and** adults, meeting space for both parish and community gatherings, and youth space. What a joy it will be when the



downstairs of Wyatt Hall is heated, air conditioned, painted, carpeted and well-lit. What a wonderful witness to our vision of welcoming all of God's people when we are able to install an elevator to provide access to the basement for everyone. And for those of you who are new to St. Philip's, Wyatt Ministry Center was "completed" in 1999. We have lived a long time with unfinished basement space.

Paying off that \$516K debt might also enable us to consider having an Associate Rector once again—thereby increasing the possibilities for other kinds of ministry and mission in the parish. We could also make our Outreach opportunities larger (i.e. a Habitat for Humanity project).

You may say, "The rector is dreaming to think we could pay this debt off." Yes, I am dreaming. But the prophets told of times when folks would dream dreams and have visions. Last year at this time, we had a vision that we could raise \$125,000 for a specific project. By year's end, we had exceeded that goal by \$7,000, and have finished half of the project **AND PAID FOR IT IN CASH!** No further debt was incurred.

Furthermore, we never used any high-pressure tactics to raise this money. Instead, we all worked hard together on a number of fundraisers—both big and small—then had a good time doing those. We discovered that doing fundraisers throughout the year both strengthened our fellowship and outreach. I believe this emphasis on joyful giving towards something aimed at responsible stewardship for what God has given us is really what made all this possible.

So let's dare to dream some more, my friends. If we focus on setting a couple of goals for 2011, and pay attention to the other things that make St. Philip's so wonderful, God will bless our dreaming, our faithful giving, our energy and our love for this parish.

Will you join me in setting—and achieving—some visionary goals in 2011? We can do it, then we will thank God for the success.

Stewardship Ministry

Food for Families



Our "Food For Families" drive started three years ago when the Stewardship Ministry learned that many families at Laurel Elementary School (LES) were struggling to put food on the table during the school year. To address this challenge, the Stewardship

Ministry decided to hold a special plate collection for 3 Sundays in late November and early December in addition to collecting food each of those Sundays.

We asked for canned foods as well as food items to complete a family's holiday meal; e.g., stuffing, gravy, cornbread mix, canned veggies and some kind of boxed dessert that would be easy to prepare. In addition, we asked for boxed cereal, healthy snacks, peanut butter and jelly, canned fruits, and meal stretchers like Hamburger Helper and pasta and sauce to go in the baskets so each family had some ready to prepare meals while the students were home on winter break. 67% of LES students qualify for the free and reduced meal program (that's breakfast and lunch), and for some, that is all they get during the day.

The first year of our drive, we made 32 boxes; the second year, we made about 35 boxes; and in this, our third year, we expanded the program to include other schools (Bond Mill, Oaklands and Deerfield), and we made 43 boxes! LES Principal Mrs. Lee contacted the other schools and neighbor Ruth Walls helped to coordinate the families at the other schools once they were contacted.

Each year of our program, Bill Miles, who owns the Laurel Meat Market, has sold us turkeys, fresh produce and fruit and potatoes at his cost to go with the baskets. The money we raise from the special plate collections is used to purchase these foods from the Laurel Meat Market, plus whatever we don't get in donations.

Members of St. Philip's Stewardship Ministry and many others that helped assemble and distribute

baskets included Debbie, Bill and Johnny Dusterwald, (Debbie was chief shopper this year and the Dusterwald family delivered about 4 boxes); Trei and Sam Massey (who were also on a delivery team); Dave and Linda Stapf; Libby, Carmen, Alexandra and Cecelia Lamancusa; Nancy Taylor; and Bill Todd. Clif and Caleb Collins also helped with deliveries and logistics, along with Gail Massiah and her friend Quincy; Terry Betzer; Deb and Paul Fitzer; and Betsy Welsh (aka "The Turkey Lady"); Susan Hayes, Jenny Wall Smith, Denise Redmond; and Amy Brennan, as did neighbors Holly and Scott Lilienthal, and their daughters, Sam and Madeline.

LES staff also helped to deliver baskets including first grade teachers Mrs. Chaffee and Mrs. Pappas, as well as staff members Ms. Mawhood and Ms. Osorio. We assembled the baskets on Friday, December 17 from 6—7 p.m. and invited the recipient families (selected by the schools; we have no say in who gets a basket) to come pick-up their baskets between 7—8:30 p.m. Deliveries were arranged for those without any means of transportation. About half were picked up and the rest were either delivered or we took them to the schools for the families to pick up.

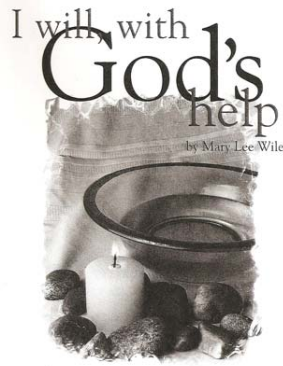
This was really the first year that any of us got to talk with some of the families we were helping and the emotions were so high, the families were so appreciative of our assistance. Our baskets fed families as small as 2 people to as large as 10 people. From single parents to grandparents raising their grandchildren, we touched over 200 people with these baskets. ABSALOM JONES MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP



St. Philip's will again be awarding two scholarships in June 2011. The scholarships are being given in honor of the Rev. Absalom Jones, first African American priest in the Episcopal Church.

The extraordinary Rev. Jones was born a slave in Delaware. As a young person he obtained a reading and writing primer, a spelling book, a New Testament Bible and taught himself to read. Eventually he purchased his wife's freedom, and then his own. He founded an insurance society for blacks, taught and founded a school for blacks, and nursed yellow fever victims during an epidemic in his hometown of Philadelphia. He was ordained a priest in the Episcopal Church in 1802.

The scholarships will be awarded to individuals who have demonstrated the qualities exemplified by the Rev. Absalom Jones such as compassion, leadership, service, and interest in education.

One of the scholarships will be awarded in honor and memory of Ellen D. Washington, the driving force behind the Absalom Jones Window and Scholarship Fund which was established in 2006. The second scholarship will be awarded in honor and memory of James Whitney, long-time St. Philip's parish leader and community volunteer.

Some recent health news and information:

Many seniors have been concerned about the impact that Health Care Reform will have on Medicare. The National Council on Aging (NCOA) has an informative write-up on this subject at: <http://www.ncoa.org/assets/files/pdf/Straight-Talk-for-Seniors.pdf>. Walking helps to slow cognitive decline, according to research presented at the recent Annual Meeting of the Radiological Society of North America. The study found that walking 72 blocks over 2 weeks helped healthy adults to reduce the risk of cognitive impairment. For adults with mild cognitive impairment, walking 58 blocks or about 5 miles a week helped to slow further cognitive decline.

A study conducted by the University of Wisconsin – LaCrosse found that older adults who practiced T'ai Chi Chih for five weeks experienced less **stress** and greater well-being. T'ai Chi Chih is a mix of **meditation** and **movement** that focuses on balance and the circulation of energy known in Chinese philosophy as chi. It was developed in 1974 by tai chi master Justin Stone as a gentler form of Tai chi for older students.
